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Human Rights in Practice

THE PROJECT

HR in Practice is a cutting-edge project aiming to help **immigrants** and **refugees** learn about their human rights, while they are learning the language of the host country. The project has developed new material, is creating a network of NGOs and language centres throughout Europe, trains teachers and mentors in the material and develops a structure of cooperation between language centres and NGOs.

The project provides newly arrived immigrants and **refugees with practical knowledge on their human rights**, in the fields of Law, Housing, Education, Work, Child Care, Immigration Laws and Economic activities and develops language training material based on the **European Conventions on Human Rights**. The material is incorporated in the language training for immigrants and refugees through **cooperation among language training centers and ethnic minority NGOs**. In this way, we contribute to the elimination of all forms of violence between men and women.

Who can benefit from the project?

- Newly arrived immigrants and refugees who want to receive language training.
- The staff and teachers of the language training centers that will get material supplementary to ordinary language training material.
- Representatives of ethnic minority NGOs that will get new knowledge and methods to inform their members about the practice of human rights in the host country.
- Local, regional and national stakeholders.

How you can benefit from the project?

- You can get language and human rights training material for A2 level students. The material is available in English, German, Greek, Portuguese and Swedish, both in electronic and printed formats.
- You are provided with an HR in Practice game and handbooks available in 12 languages. It is an educational game, promoting dialogue on human rights with a focus on the rights of women and children.
- You can participate in the train the trainers education for languages teachers, NGO staff and social workers in using the material.
- You can be a member of a growing network of organizations with better human rights information and build your organization's capacity.
- You get practical information and knowledge for refugees and immigrants on their new country.

THE PRINCIPLES OF Human Rights in Practice Project

Non-discrimination is a cross-cutting principle in international human rights law. All countries have ratified at least one human right treaty.
